School Lunches



Most children are now taking up the offer of a free, hot meat/vegetarian meal or sandwich platter each day.

If your child currently has a packed lunch, why not give the daily school meal a try. They are nutritionally balanced, use local produce and support healthy diets.

If you continue to send your child with their own packed lunch, they must meet healthy standards. Please don't provide too much food, the children have a dedicated half hour to eat their food.

Attendance

It is essential that all children are punctual. If your child is absent/late please phone to give reasons (01773 713429). If your child is absent due to medical appointments, which should be taken out of school times whenever possible, please phone and keep appointment cards/letters.

In September 2013 the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) (Amendment)
Regulations 2013 came into force. These regulations make it clear that Headteachers should not grant approval for any leave of absence during term-time, including holidays, unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Charges

Please ensure that all payments for after school clubs, nursery lunch times, including meals and Breakfast Club are paid promptly and in advance. Our School Charging Policy states that, School is not obliged to provide Extended Services provision which include activities and clubs outside of the school day until settlement of any debt has been made. Failure to make payment may result in your child being withdrawn from such provision.

INFANT & JUNIOR SCHOOL PLACES 2023

If your child is due to start infant school in September 2023 (birthdays between 1st September 2018 and 31st August 2019) or junior school (birthdays between 1st September 2015 and 31st August 2016) you must apply for their place by 15th January 2023. You will be able to make your application from 9am on 7th November up to the closing date of 15th January 2023. You will notified about the places on 17th April 2023 You can do this online at
