Expressive Arts and Design



Play is children's work and the importance of play is all about learning. Children learn through exploring, watching and listening, creating, communicating and investigating. It can also be very messy with sand, water, paint and outdoor with mud kitchens etc. Children will have fun but you can expect them to get very mucky too!

EYFS Unit



3/4 Years Nursery Age Children will mainly learn through play-based activities. They will be learning about routines and developing social skills, early literacy skills, including phonics and develop early math skills. We have lots of practical activities and offer a range of indoor and outdoor activities. There is free flow time which provides excellent opportunities for children to choose their own activities and we also have one-to-one or small group focused learning.

Children will also enjoy story time and have the opportunity to listen and take part in many adventures, they will get to enjoy singing and rhyme time.

Reception Age Children will continue to be given the opportunity to take part in play based activities but will start to have more structured sessions for learning in subjects such as Literacy, Mathematic, Phonics to help them get ready for Year 1.

We carefully plan a wide range of exciting, first-hand experiences and expose them to quality language and literature.

We teach them daily phonics until they are ready to move onto Y2 spellings.

In Year 2 we ensure children are becoming fantastic learners who will continue to flourish as they leave for Key Stage Two (Juniors)

Special Educational Needs/Inclusion

Those who have been turned down by other settings are warmly welcomed and flourish in this all accepting and nurturing environment".

Lunch Times



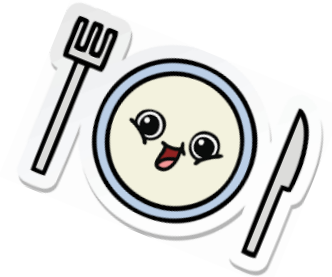

Church School

Our RE learning follows the Derbyshire agreed syllabus, enhanced by the Understanding Christianity resource, with stand alone lessons taught weekly in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2.

Collective Worship



Each day we will promote our overarching whole school vision which is:

'Always our best for God, each other and ourselves'

~ 'Whatever the activity in which you engage, do it with all your ability ...' Ecclesiastes 9:10

The provision of Collective Worship conforms to Diocesan policy.

There is a daily act of collective worship that is according to the faith and practice of the Church of England. It takes place every day at 10:40 am and lasts for approximately between 15-30 minutes. The content takes into account the age, aptitude and family circumstances of the children.

School Uniform

Our active uniform is:

plain white polo shirt (with or without the school logo)

plain royal blue sweatshirt or v-neck jumper or cardigan (with or without the school logo)

plain black / dark grey tracksuit bottoms or leggings (long or cropped) or sports shorts
(not fashion shorts or denim or skort)

plain black shoes or trainers (velcro unless child can tie own laces with no logos/branding)

plain black pumps for PE (to be kept in a drawstring bag in school to avoid wet/mud in the hall)

pair of wellies (to be kept in a plastic bag on pegs)

Jewellery

We have a strict 'no jewellery' policy across nursery and school for all pupils.

Children are not usually permitted to wear any jewellery for school, including earrings, unless prior consent has been given by the Headteacher, this may be granted in exceptional circumstances and earrings must be taped by parents / carers before the child attends school.

Clubs

Afterschool clubs consist of school led activities and some are led by external providers.

Children have the opportunity to take part in activities such as Multi-Skills, Fencing, Gymnastics, Football, Archery and much more.

Our children may represent our school during competitions.



Safeguarding

Keeping Children Safe is Everyone's responsibility!

We teach children about being safe, we ask questions.

It is our legal duty to do everything we can to keep children safe!

As one of our Designated Safeguarding Leads Mrs Crossley may wish to speak with you to ask questions and offer support. It is the aim of Mrs Crossley to work closely with families ensuring lines of communication remain open and support is offered where necessary. She may at times speak to parents/carers about things which have been brought to her attention. Please don't be offended if you are asked any questions - its' about keeping all children safe.

Attendance is also a safeguarding issue and we have a duty to ensure every child gets the best opportunity and education possible. If your child's attendance is a cause for concern you may be invited to a meeting to establish what we can do to help.

Early Help

From time to time there may be situations where you need extra support and some additional help, please come and speak to us. We can offer advice, listen to you, point you in the right direction to other agencies.

As a school we offer Early Help to any family that needs it.
