ATTENDANCE & PUNCTUALITY

The government have changed their expectation of attendance for this year. We shared the poster last term with the new expectations which we have to follow. I have attached a copy with this as a reminder.

As a school our attendance has been significantly lower than it should be so we have worked hard to produce a flowchart to support you with what will happen if attendance is lower than it should be and how we want to reward good attendance. You had a copy of this last year and it can be found on our website. Please ask if you would like another copy.

Please can you try really hard to ensure your child is attending school and on time (lateness can also affect their attendance rate too).

Remember to let the office know before school if your child is unwell so we can log it.

In school, the bell rings on the rear playground at 8.50am to allow the children five minutes to get into school, hang their coats/bags up and be ready for the register at the start time of 8.55am

MEDICATION

Please remember that if your child needs to take prescribed medicine in school, a medical form must be completed at the main school office. We cannot administer medicines that are not prescribed or less than x4 times daily dosage.

BEHAVIOUR

We worked really hard on our behaviour last year and the new behaviour blueprint has made it really clear to children, parents and staff. We know that the vast majority of our children behave well every day and so we have plenty of reward systems in place.

Our main aim is to approach behaviour by praising the positives. Our motto is 'Praise in Public, Reprimand in Private'.

There will be lots of praise and reward when children make good choices and we will be ensuring you, as parents know through sending your child home with stickers, postcards, via text/dojo or a positive phone call.

There will be times when a child doesn't make the right choice and we want them to learn behaviours have consequences using a positive approach and through a restorative approach and reflection.

We will still be having bucket bonanza on a Friday for 30 minutes for the children who have made fantastic choices that week.

HOME LEARNING

The home learning for this term will be a focus on Reading and Phonics as it is such a vital skill that children need to gain..
The expectation is for you to read 5 times a week with your child.

NO SMOKING

Please remember that the school grounds are no smoking or vaping throughout. We also ask that entrance gate areas remain smoke free too. It is very unpleasant for nonsmoking children and adults to have no choice but to walk through plumes of smoke on their way into and out of school. Please be mindful of the health and safety of all our pupils and their families.

INDIVIDUAL PHOTOGRAPHS

All children will have individual photographs taken on <u>Wednesday</u>

11th September from 8.00am for photos with siblings in another school. I can't wait to see them all come on that day looking extra smart.

UNIFORM

A reminder of our active uniform expectations.

- A plain white polo shirt (with or without the school logo)
- A plain royal blue sweatshirt or v-neck jumper or cardigan (with or without the school logo)
- Plain black/dark grey tracksuit bottoms or leggings or shorts (not fashion shorts or denim) or a skort.
- Plain black shoes or trainers (Velcro unless child can tie their own laces with no logos or branding)
- Plain black pumps for PE (to be kept in a drawstring bag in school to avoid wet/mud in the hall
- A pair of wellies (to be kept in a plastic bag on pegs)

Depending on the weather please bring in sun hats, suntan lotion (to be kept in school with the child's name on) or raincoats etc.

Your child also needs to bring their book bag into school every day. Please remember it is no rucksacks (due to space on pegs).

We also have a <u>no jewellery</u> in school policy for children.

We're teaching every child to read with Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised A complete SSP validated by the Department for Education

This year we have changed to a new Phonics Scheme called Little Wandle. It is used by a large number of schools across the country and has a fantastic reputation. It is aimed to support with phonics and reading so children will be getting new books this year (please look after these as we need to ensure we have enough for children to use throughout the year and moving forward).

Later this term, Mrs Wilmott (our English Lead) will be doing a workshop and inviting parents in to see what the new scheme involves.

Little Wandle has a lot of videos and resources for parents as well which we will share with you as and when needed through the year. We hope you find these helpful when supporting your child.
